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Capital Improvement Program (CIP) FINAL Meeting Minutes September 17, 2015

The meeting of the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) was called to order on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 7:00 PM, by Chairman Rob Gustafson, at the Community Development Department.

# I. Call to Order

## **II. Updates to Project Request Submittals**

- Mr. Hohenberger updated the Committee on the 4<sup>th</sup> round truck purchase. Although, the town has the \$180,000 set aside for the 4<sup>th</sup> round truck, which was approved by the voters, it is due to lapse on 12/31/15. Round four funding has not been committed to the town as of yet. It is unlikely we will accomplish the round 4 purchase this year, so a new request has been submitted, to the CIP, for funding as a replacement for the 2014 truck.
  - Mr. Hohenberger updated the Committee on the spreadsheet the Mrs. Bottai put together regarding what would be required to update the entire vault.
  - Mr. Hohenberger also updated the Committee on the revaluations in Windham. The Committee may need to rethink the \$0.75.
- Ken Eyring Representing School board requests
  - Requesting \$750k annually instead of \$682k? Allows the school board to put money aside annually to fund future bond payment should the school project pass the voters either in 2016 or at a future town meeting.
  - Roger: middle school and center school were funded via CIP, Impact fees could be leveraged to reduce overall costs annually (~150k)
  - Dennis who dictated \$0.75 rate? Roger values were set at planning board significantly longer than 9 years prior.

- Jennifer if you continue trying and the school project does not pass, the funding would continue to accrue annually with out a committed plan. That funding would significantly eat up half of the CIP budget.
- Paul Where does the 800k allotment end? Until the overcrowding is addressed
- Dan Where is the CNA vs Bond funding accounted for?
- Dennis You would need to adjust the CIP percentage to account for the overall needs of the town, how do we address specific needs of the town (ie: trucks, trailers, loaders, roads, etc)
- Rob when Center and Middle school when did they drop the rate? What precipitated the rate change?
- Ken Is the CNA a good request? Neelima No because it is not capital improvement
- Rob the plan is for 2016 and 2016 only not viable for any future year without additional information to be provided prior to the Town Meeting

Dennis – previous years votes were based on how CNA would be managed
Motion to move forward to add capital reserve fund for the school district for new construction and/or renovations with placeholder number of 800k knowing there is variability to the number – Paul Gosselin. Second Roger Hohenberger - Motion passes 6-1 (Dennis)

- Ken what needs to occur next?
- Action Written request by Mr Steele must be submitted to Staff for review by CIP for the Capital Reserve Fund of 800k for 2016 Town Meeting

Passive Recreation - Cheryl Haas

- Dennis must look at what is presented
- In Accordance with the Master plan (2005, 2012, 2015 editions)
- Dave Curdo highlighting town beautification
