Seat Alternates

The Chairman appointed Mr. Rouillard to replace Mr. Morris for this meeting.

25 North Shore Road, Lot 16-D-14

Mr. Joseph Maynard of Benchmark Engineering explained that the original variance application was withdrawn because the applicant changed the design.

- 7 foot deck is being pushed back to 9 feet.
- Shoreline Protection is fine with rebuilding on the exact footprint and no closer to the lake.
- The garage falls within the WWPD and the Cobbetts Pond Ordinance buffer requirement from streams that feed the pond.
- Cobbetts Pond is exempt from WWPD.
- Garage will be within close proximity to the road.
- There will be drainage improvements off of the driveway
- There will be drainage improvements to the grass area.
- Lot coverage 13%.
- Mitigation will be done with infiltration.



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Mr. Rouillard said that this is overuse of the site with a garage and accessory apartment and the Commission should not endorse added uses near the pond.

Mr. Maynard requested a positive letter from the Conservation Commission.

Mr. Senibaldi motioned and Mr. Dell'Orfano seconded the motion to send a letter to the Zoning Board stating that the Conservation Commission has no issues with the plan as presented and the Commission prefers Option A. **Motion passed 6-1.** Mr. Rouillard voted against the motion.

Discussion – Moeckel Pond

Mr. Alan Carpenter of 8 Glenwood Road explained that the state is ordering Moeckel Pond drained because of the poor condition of the dam that is cracked and leaking and is a risk to a town road. Some of the concrete has eroded and there has been no maintenance. Safety is the first priority of the Dam Bureau. The dam can no longer handle a fifty year storm. The thought occurred to Mr. & Mrs. Carpenter to buy the lots, subdivide, and sell them and then have enough money to do the repairs to the dam. This could be accomplished if the repair bill was \$30,000.00 to \$50,000.00. Mr. Carpenter received four proposals; one firm quoted \$30,000.00 to do the engineering and \$150,000.00 to \$200,000.00 to repair the dam. Mr. Carpenter asked the Commission if they find value in Moeckel Pond and if they are in a position to find a joint solution to figure out a way to save it.

Mr. Senibaldi said because this parcel abuts conservation land maybe there is some way to work together.

In talking with the Dam Bureau and Engineering Firms Mr. Carpenter found that if this simple structure is properly repaired you can expect at least a 50 year lifespan without any repairs. Mr. Carpenter gave a brief history of the dam and its construction. NHDES has been sending communications to the owner for two years regarding the repairs. The notices have been ignored. NHDES is about to issue a work order to drain the pond. Mr. Carpenter went on to say that one NH Engineering Firm agreed to do the engineering in phases. Phase I of the engineering would cost \$9300.00 (full engineering cost would be \$30,000.00). Phase I would provide a rough outline of drawings and enough detail to bid to construction companies.

Mr. Norm Young of 1 Jordan Road said if the pond is drained all wildlife will be gone.

Mr. Neil Fallon of 26 Rock Pond Road said there are 12-15 residents on the pond and the Town is also a resident of Moeckel Pond and if it is drained it will be gone forever.

Diane Carpenter of 8 Glenwood Road said that Moeckel Pond is a community resource.



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The Chairman said that this proposal has already been denied by the Board of Selectmen because they were concerned about liability.

Mr. Carpenter said that engineering would be an eight week process.

Mr. Senibaldi motioned and Miss Skinner seconded the motion to expend \$9300.00 for Phase I of the engineering process and Mr. Rouillard would be the contact person to work with Mr. Carpenter. **Motion passed 7-0.**

Mr. Dell'Orfano would like to see the proposal.

Discussion – High School Trail

Mr. Warren Billings, Facilities Manager for Windham School District

Mr. Billings asked for permission from the Commission for the Cross Country Team to use a portion of the existing trail. The team needs a larger competitive running course. Mr. Billings also asked for permission to allow the students to maintain the trails. They would not cut any brush, there would not be any tree or rock removal, no changes would be made. Mr. Rouillard asked if Mr. Billings was sure that no grading would be done. Mr. Billings said no earth or material would be moved.

Discussion – Procedure TRC Meetings

Laura Scott, Community Development Director

Ms. Scott read her June 18, 2010 memo regarding the participation and process of the Technical Review Committee. There is concern by the Community Development Staff, the Planning Board Chair and some applicants regarding the lack of participation in the TRC process. Back in March of 2009 the Conservation Commission agreed to the TRC process.

There has been a noticeable decrease in attendance and a lack of written comments regarding the applications. Applicants are being requested to meet with individual Department Staff and Committees instead of participating in the TRC process. This creates problems for the applicant, staff and Planning Board with timing of applications going to the Planning Board, receiving input in a timely manner and confidence that the material being presented is the same for every Department/Committee and ensuring a streamlined process for the applicant.

Although the Commission is not obligated to attend the TRC meetings, others find it helpful to hear questions and concerns raised at the meetings by other participants.



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The only deviation from the established TRC process was for the Historic District Committee and the Conservation Commission. You were supposed to send a representative to the meetings if possible and review the material at your meetings and provide comments on the applications. If you wanted to schedule a site walk or have the applicant attend a meeting you were to inform the department staff so they could work with the applicant to meet your request.

The Chairman said that as long as he informs Ms. Scott that the Commission needs to review a plan she will take care of scheduling that plan to be seen at a Conservation meeting.

Ms. Scott said it would be easier for the applicant to do a site walk with all Boards and Committees at one time.

Mr. Rouillard said that with little exception any subdivision that has been reviewed in the last two decades the Commission has had comments.

Ms. Scott said she wants the Commission's participation in the TRC process.

Mr. Rouillard said he will make it a point to respond more regularly to the TRC agenda.

Mr. Rouillard said the Commission has not had a chance to discuss the master plan.

Ms. Scott said the Commission could have till Tuesday, June 29, 2010 to submit their master plan comments.

Mr. Rouillard motioned and Mr. Senibaldi seconded the motion to approve the June 10, 2010 minutes. **Motion passed 7-0.**
